- Take I-77 South to Highway 21
- Highway 21 turns into Brecksville Road after .5 miles
- Follow Brecksville Road for .8 miles
- Harry's Steakhouse is on the right side on the street

From the South:

- Take I-77 North to Rockside Road
- Turn right onto Rockside Road at the end of the exit ramp
- Follow Rockside Road to Brecksville Road (Highway 21)
- Turn left on Brecksville Road.

- Proceed on Brecksville Road approximately 1 mile, Harry's Steakhouse is on the left side of the street.

From the East and West via I-480:

- Take I-480 to I-77 South
- Exit at Rockside Road
- Turn left onto Rockside Road at the end of the exit ramp
- Follow Rockside Road to Brecksville Road
- Turn left on Brecksville Road
- Proceed on Brecksville Road approximately 1 mile

Angelo has held other security management positions with Ernst & Young, the Defense Advanced Research Projects Agency (DARPA), and the National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA). He also served as a military intelligence officer in the U.S. Army.

He has a B.A. in Criminology from Indiana University of Pennsylvania, Master's Certificate in Information Systems from George Washington University, and an Executive Security Management Certification from The Wharton School, University of Pennsylvania. He also maintains professional certifications as both a Certified Information Systems Security Professional (CISSP) and Certified Information Security Manager (CISM).
